The Summer School will take place at the campus of [Tilburg University](#) in The Netherlands.

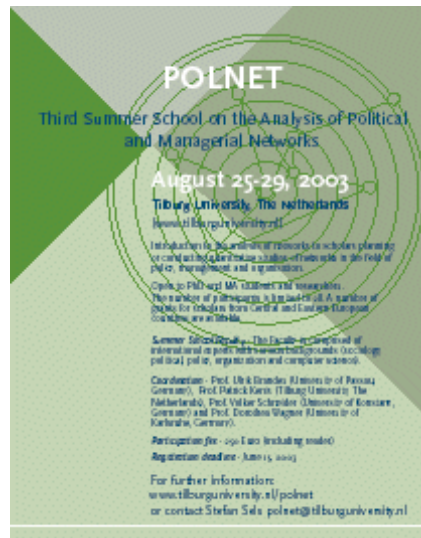
