Applications

Apply now for the Zukunftskolleg's Funding Programmes!

The Zukunftskolleg has issued new calls for applications for several funding instruments. For the first time, all programmes are open to all postdoctoral researchers at the University of Konstanz. Find all calls for applications here/beta/2015/.



<u>The Investment Programme for Research</u> aims to improve apparatus and equipment in research. Participants can apply for apparatus requiring an outlay of between EUR 5.000 and EUR 10.000 for use in conducting their research. **Deadline: July 16, 2017.**

<u>The Mentorship Programme</u> enables postdoctoral researchers at the University of Konstanz to network with distinguished colleagues both in Germany and abroad, and to maintain these contacts. **Deadline: September 30, 2017.**

<u>The Independent Research Grant</u> aims to promote independent research by researchers who are in the early stages of their postdoctoral work. The Zukunftskolleg invites applications for financial support of up to EUR 5,000 for projects that help the individual applicant attain scientific independence. **Deadline: September 30, 2017.**

<u>The Interdisciplinary Collaborative Projects Programme</u> gives grant holders the opportunity to identify and explore new, innovative and/or risky research perspectives with neighbouring disciplines and across disciplines. **Deadline: September 30, 2017.**

<u>The Transdepartmental Collaborative Teaching Programme</u> aims to promote the development of new teaching courses and expand departmental syllabi. It gives grant holders the opportunity to explore new, innovative topics in teaching and to further develop their teaching skills and teaching approach across disciplines. **Deadline: November 1, 2017.**

<u>The Intersectoral Cooperative Programme</u> aims to develop cooperations between junior researchers and the non-academic sector. Grants will be given to support cooperations that foster joint research projects with industrial partners, companies, social institutions, cultural institutions, archives, public bodies, or non-profit organisations. **Deadline: November 1, 2017.**

Workshop: Popular Culture in the Arab World

Popular culture has been playing an important role in shaping social and political processes, especially with the recent growing use of social media and digital communication that have become a stage for personal expression and an arena for power struggles, protests and repression. Throughout the 20th century, the Arab world has gone through important changes in reference to de-colonization, the emergence of national identities and economic liberalization, all of which were reflected in popular culture.

In recent years, these issues are raised in parallel with the political instability and are accompanied by an internal dialogue about the renewal of Arab culture and its characteristics.

The aim of the course is to introduce the audience to contemporary Arab popular culture in its variations and complexities, and to discuss theoretical and interpretive ideas to better understand it. More...

Careers

Starting July, <u>Borbála Zsuzsanna Möller Török</u> (Research Fellow/Dept. of History and Sociology) will take up a Lise Meitner position at the Faculty of Historical and Cultural Studies of the University of Vienna (Austria). She will be working in the project "Describe and Govern. Statistics and State Building in the Composite Habsburg States, 1770-1867".

Starting July, <u>Barbara Hausmair</u> (Postdoctoral Fellow/Dept. of History and Sociology) will work as postdoctoral researcher at Free University of Berlin, Institute for Ancient Near Eastern Archaeology. The project focuses on the archaeological research of the Nazi forced labour camp at Tempelhof Airport.
