


## CREST!

Many houses in Konstanz have a name written on their walls because previously houses were located by names and not by numbers or street names as they are today.


There is a house called Haus zum Pelikan on the Marktstraße with an ice cream shop inside. Can you find it? What is the name of the ice cream shop?

The City of Konstanz is already a very old town. Many other cities in Germany were destroyed in attacks during the Second World War. But Konstanz was lucky because it is so close to Switzerland and nobody wanted to attack its Swiss neighbours by mistake. That is why the old buildings in Konstanz have survived. The oldest district of Konstanz is called Niederburg, where you can still find the ancient houses from the Middle Ages.
