
Who participated?


Online Survey

- Poll of 753 International full-time students, i.e. Students seeking a degree from the University of Konstanz
 - 25% response (189)
 - Winter semester 2010/11

Country of Origin - 35.8% Eastern Europe

(excluding Austria/Switzerland) - 6% China











Mastering the start of your Studies

Beginning your studies - easy going?

- + Understanding the German language without difficulties (73%)
- + Recognition of previous academic achievements (69%)
- Room/Apartment search: 60% difficult and 12.1% partly difficult
- 56% were unaware of the services offered for international students
- Information about the organizational processes for registration and other formalities at the beginning of studies – 41.6% sufficient und 26.5% to some extent
- Residence Permits: 26.6 % difficult and 14.8% partly difficult

What was helpful at the beginning of studies?

- Help with course selections (74%)
- Help with filling out forms and other formalities (69%)
- Courses offered in German as a foreign language (69%)
- Guiding tours around the campus (68%)







Why study at the University of Konstanz?

Academics:

- 45.2% profile of the programme
- 39.3% good ranking results of the university
- 38.2% good reputation of the university and faculty

Environmental Factors:

- 41.4% attractiveness of the city and region
- 37.1% close to relatives, partners and friends

Differences between Bachelor and Master Students:

- For Bachelor students the priorities lay in the ranking results and the social and spatial environment
- For Master's students the profile of the programme and reputation of the university and faculty were most persuasive













Positive/ Satisfying:

- + level of academic requirement
- + quality of teaching
- + content coordination of course offerings
- + material resources
- + academic counselling: 43% utilization, 80% were satisfied

Negative/ Improvements needed:

- studies, timetable and exam organisation
- courses to help reduce any knowledge deficits
 /more additional support in difficult faculties/ study techniques
- time and course overload
- more support from professors
- exam preparation/ supervision for thesis

Abandoning studies?

- 70% had not considered it

Would recommend the university? - 72.9 %







Use of Services





• 82% Student Service Center (SSZ)


- 43% Academic advising
- 38% Private rooms, housing agency
- 33% Advising by student organizations
- 33% Central student advisory
- 25% Advising by International Office
- I 8% Foreign language partners (Tandem)
- I 4% Advice on student financing
- 6.5% Mentoring Program
- 4.3% Psychotherapeutic Counselling Center







- 25% in residences (including couple's apartments, mostly in shared apartments)
- 56% private rental housing
- I 6% rent-free with relatives or friends
- Average rent (including heating costs) per month: 300 Euro
- Apartment search:
 - 52% own search
 - 25% friends
 - 19% Student Services
 - 3% International Office
- Living situation: features, size, relationship with landlord, undisturbed work, good neighbourhood:
 - over 70% are satisfied
 - 40% unhappy with the distance from the university









Financing of Studies



- Most are financed privately or from a part-time job (ca. 500 Euro per month)
- More than half are dependent on a part-time job
- About half are able to manage with their budget, the other 50% have to limit their spending
- •23% work as student assistants, 29% are temporary workers
- Students of the natural sciences work within their field
- 25% wanted to work but found no job
- 33% of the working students confirmed that their part time job was very demanding







Cultural and Social Integration

- More than half get on well with German forms of communication, while a third have persistent difficulties
- + Cooperation and socializing with German students worked well for nearly two-thirds of the students
- + 43% discuss personally important issues with 2 to 5 Germans
- Individually perceived discrimination:
 - 33% related to housing
 - 35% at шогк
 - 38% during studies
 - 47% from authorities
 - 50% in other situations









Comparison of BA and Master Studies / Sections

Bachelor	and	Master (B/M)	

Survey Participation:

50% B, 30% M

Knowledge of procedures and support services:

35-45% B, 56-65% M

Satisfied with support from teachers:

60% B, 70% M

Recommendation of studies:

80% B, 67% M

Socializing with other students is difficult:

28% B, 44% M

Sections in Comparison

MN – Mathematic / Natural Sciences section G – Humanities Section RWV – Law, -Business- und Administration Section

Satisfaction: greatest with RWV students, 84%

Basic conditions: MN with the highest results in all categories


Need for filling knowledge gaps: highest in G with 60%

Had considered abandoning studies: most commonly in G with 34%

Working while studying: the highest level with 5 I % in G
