
Cooperations

Collegium Helveticum

The <u>Collegium Helveticum</u> and the Zukunftskolleg are intensifying their institutional collaboration. The Collegium Helveticum is an Institute for Advanced Study connected with the University of Zurich, ETH Zurich, and Zurich University of the Arts. It fosters multidisciplinary research across the social, natural and medical sciences, the humanities, engineering and art.

Thomas Hengartner, director of the Collegium Helveticum, visited the Zukunftskolleg on February 15. He presented the concept of the Collegium Helveticum and its current research focus in the Jour Fixe. Future possibilities on joint workshops, research stays for Fellows and other projects and events were discussed.

The next joint project will be a workshop in June conducted by <u>Attila Tanyi</u>, Associated Fellow of the Zukunftskolleg. The workshop will take place both at the Collegium Helveticum in Zurich and at the Zukunftskolleg in Konstanz.
