

### Residence Permit for studies in Germany

#### **Process**

- 1. Online application
- 2. Personal appointment
- 3. Pick-up residence permit card



#### Mind deadlines:

- Entry with Visa: Apply within validity of visa
- Visa-free entry: apply within 90 days of entry to Schengen area

## Residence Permit for studies in Germany

#### Required documents for online application:

- completed online application form
- passport
- health insurance
- official admission letter of the University of Konstanz
- proof of financial ressources for 1 year:
  - i.e.: 934 EUR / month x 12 months = 11.208 EUR

## **Health Insurance**

• EU students: EHIC (European Health Insurance Card) | UK students: GHIC (Global Health Insurance Card)


Non-EU/EEA: German State Health Insurance

Only the German health insurances are accepted by immigration authorities and university (except EHIC/GHIC/bilateral agreements)

30 years or older: take out German private health insurance

## **Financial Proof**

- A formal written commitment from relatives or acquaintances submitted to a German Diplomatic Mission abroad or Local Immigration Office in Germany
- Scholarship confirmation (monthly)
- Written confirmation of financial support from your parents
- blocked account (opened at German bank)
- Work contract (working hours & hourly pay)



## Residence Permit for studies in Germany

### **Personal appointment:**

- passport
- biometrical passport-sized photo
- original documents
- enrollment certificate with preliminary end of studies (ssz@uni-konstanz.de)
- Administration fee:
  - Ca. 100 110 €
  - Exempted of payment if you are recipient of a scholarship granted by German state or EU

# Work permit

#### **Non EU Students**

as stated in visa or individual regulations of residence permit:

- 120 full days or 240 half days / calendar year
- off campus vs. on campus
- self-employed / free lance: apply for extra permit




## **Work permit**

### Non EU Students: internship

- all internships count as employment, hence a work permit is always required
- a compulsory intership does not count
- a voluntary internship counts, even if unpaid

# How to extend your Residence Permit

- Same documents needed as for first time application
- Enrolment certificate with expected end of studies
- Proof of finance: Job contract (working hours & hourly pay)



## **Extension of Residence Permit**

- Residence permit only valid for 2 years (max.) > 10 years limit
- When leaving Schengen, make sure your residence permit is valid until after your return
- When leaving Schengen for longer then 6 months, permission by Immigration Office needed
  - →otherwise: **loss of residence permit** (void)

# Studytime abroad?

- For re-entry, residence permit for Germany must be valid **until after** your return to Konstanz.
- Visa application for the country of stay
- Or european mobility within the scope of the REST directive
- If necessary, please do apply for extension of the residence permit **BEFORE** travelling abroad.





No possibility of applying for extension of residence permit from abroad!

# Change of degree programme

- Residence permit issued for specific degree studies at a specific university
- You are free to change your study programme within the first 18 months (3 semester) after starting your studies.
- Later on, changing the study programme *may* be approved (subject to decision of the immigration authority) if the studies can be completed within a reasonable period of time, i.e. up to a total duration of stay of 10 years.

# Change of purpose of stay

Change of purpose of stay of the residence permit is generally not possible. Exceptions:

- Change to employment as a skilled worker
- Change to professional training
- Legal entitlement

Otherwise always departure and renewed visa application

# After graduation

- As a graduate of a German University you have access to good career opportunities in Germany.
- As a citizen if a non EU Country, you are required to have a work permit if you want to stay and work in Germany.
- There are several different types of residence permits, such as job seeker, to take up qualified employment,...


